

SETTING THE STANDARDS FOR QUALITY OPIOID ADDICTION TREATMENT

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Opioid use disorder (OUD) is a chronic disease affecting nearly 10 million individuals nationwide, leading to serious potential consequences, including disability, relapses, and death.¹ Approximately 100,000 people in the U.S. die from drug-involved overdoses annually, with 75% of those deaths involving an opioid.² Yet - it is estimated only one in five individuals with OUD received evidence-based Medication-assisted treatment (MAT).³

Acadia Healthcare's network of Comprehensive Treatment Centers is the leading provider of opioid treatment programs (OTPs) in the United States, serving more than 72,500 patients each day across 165 clinics nationwide.

Our programs are working and saving lives: across Acadia's network of Comprehensive Treatment Centers, an average of 72% of drug tests for illicit opioid use have been negative over the last five years compared to research that shows relapse rates can be as high as 90% without treatment.

Improving the quality of clinical care in opioid treatment programs is essential for several reasons:

- 1. Patient safety:** Opioid addiction is a serious and potentially life-threatening condition. Patients who seek treatment for opioid addiction are often at risk for experiencing withdrawal symptoms and other health complications. Quality treatment programs ensure that patients receive safe and effective care, including monitoring and interventions as needed.
- 2. Effectiveness:** High-quality treatment programs have proved to be more effective in helping patients achieve and maintain recovery. Effective programs use evidence-based practices and individualized treatment plans that are tailored to the patient's unique needs and circumstances.
- 3. Avoiding relapse:** Quality programs provide ongoing support and resources to help patients avoid relapse. This can include counseling, medication management, and connections with community resources.
- 4. Community impact:** Opioid addiction is a public health problem that affects not only individuals but also families, communities, and society as a whole. Quality opioid treatment programs can help mitigate the social and economic impacts of opioid addiction by improving educational outcomes, increasing employment, and enhancing community well-being.
- 5. Cost-effectiveness:** High-quality opioid treatment programs can be more cost-effective in the long run by helping patients achieve and maintain recovery, as well as by reducing healthcare costs associated with emergency department visits, hospitalizations, and other medical complications related to opioid addiction. Nearly 8% of all healthcare expenditures by U.S. hospitals annually are on care for patients who have opioid use disorder.⁵

Opioid treatment programs are highly regulated due to the nature of the services provided. One of the key primary regulators, CARF International (formerly known as the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities), is a highly respected and prestigious accreditor of human resource providers and networks. The organization provides accreditations for a number of programs and services, including opioid treatment programs. CARF International has accredited more than 67,000 programs at more than 31,000 locations across countries, states, territories, and provinces on five continents.⁶

CARF's accreditation process measures the performance of treatment centers across 13 specific standards.

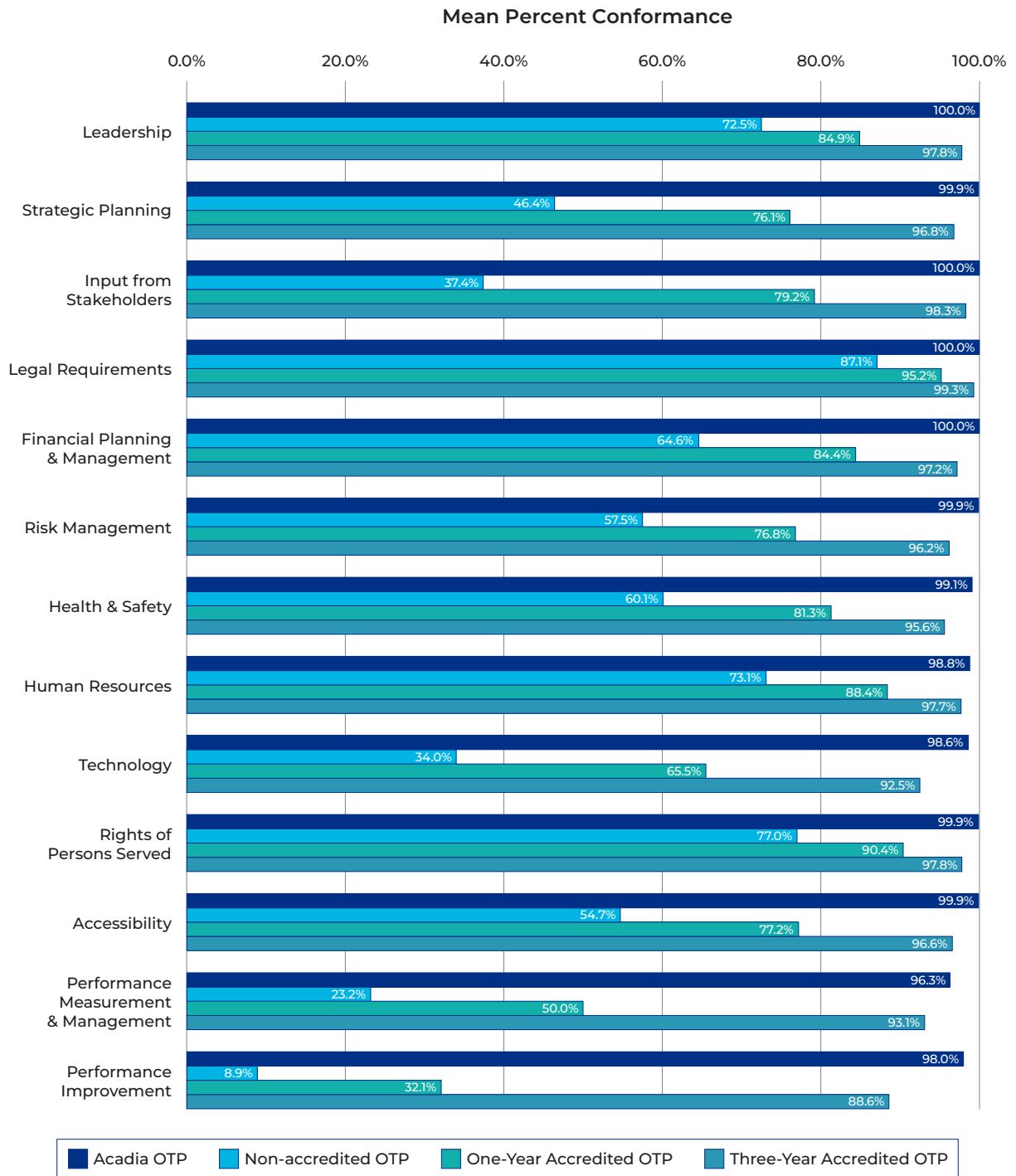
- 1. Leadership:** The organization has effective leadership practices that support its mission, vision, and values.
- 2. Strategic planning:** The organization has a clear and effective plan for achieving its goals and objectives.
- 3. Input from stakeholders:** The organization actively seeks input and feedback from individuals and groups who have a stake in its services.
- 4. Legal requirements:** The organization meets all applicable legal and regulatory requirements.
- 5. Financial planning and management:** The organization has effective financial management practices that ensure its financial sustainability and accountability.
- 6. Risk management:** The organization has effective risk management practices that identify, assess, and mitigate potential risks to individuals, staff, and the organization as a whole.
- 7. Health and safety:** The organization has effective health and safety practices that ensure the well-being of individuals and staff.
- 8. Human resources:** The organization has effective human resource practices that support the recruitment, retention, and development of qualified staff.
- 9. Technology:** The organization uses technology in a way that enhances its services and operations.
- 10. Rights of persons served:** The organization promotes and protects the rights and dignity of individuals served, and ensures that they are treated with respect and are able to participate in decisions about their care.
- 11. Accessibility:** Services are provided in a way that is accessible to all individuals who need them, regardless of their disabilities, language, culture, or geography.
- 12. Performance measurement and management:** The organization has effective performance measurement and management practices that monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of services, and use data to drive continuous improvement.
- 13. Performance improvement:** The organization has effective processes in place to identify opportunities for improvement and implement changes to enhance its services.

When a program receives accreditation from CARF, it is evidence that the treatment provider has passed intensive reviews and meets the required criteria for superior quality and the provision of exceptional clinical services.

The table on the next page outlines Acadia's Comprehensive Treatment Centers' scores. Acadia achieved outstanding scores across all CARF measures — including scores of 100% on several of CARF's quality measures.
